Working knowledge of Malay is an advantage. • Demonstrated ability to work in and lead a multi-disciplinary and cross-cultural team.
Monthly Stipend	Subject to qualifications, experience and designated workload at the Centre and the Faculty of Economics and Administration.
Terms of Fellowship	This appointment is for the minimum period of one (1) year beginning from the date of reporting duty. However, the Director of CPDS may recommend the extension of your service if necessary and/or subject to satisfactory performance.
